Spring 2016 Workshops and Classes:

We appreciate your support with regards to the new sign-up procedures listed below. Most of you worked very hard to adhere to new procedures, and we are very grateful for that. As of Monday, January 18th (which is a School Holiday, so if you have questions on that day, we are unfortunately not available to answer them until Tuesday) you can sign up for any classes/workshops that are open.

Workshop/Class sign-up procedures for the Spring 2016 semester:

To give all of our students a chance to sign-up for workshops, we are asking you to please take the following procedures for sign-ups for the Spring 2016 workshop schedule to heart:

- 1) **On Day 1** of sign-ups, please sign up for **3 workshops per student only**
- 2) If a workshop/class has a "*" next to it, and your student has attended that workshop previously, please do not sign up for that workshop during the first week at all, to give others a chance.
- 3) **On Day 2** of sign-ups, you may sign up for **3 more classes per student**, with the exception of any workshop/class that has "*" and your student has attended that workshop/class before (see above)
- 4) Any classes/workshops that are still open after the first week of sign-ups are open to anybody. However, we ask that you do not sign up for more workshop/ classes than you are actually willing and able to attend.

- 5) If you are interested in a workshop/class that is full, please email Tezo, so he can put you on the waitlist
- **Also, please note that if your student has to miss a workshop, we are asking you to email Tezo (tezo.vasquez@roavc.com), so we can mark the student absent. Should your student have two unexcused workshop absences, we will open up the spot to another student on the waitlist.**

How to sign up with Sign-Up Genius

Sign-up genius will open on Monday, January 11th at 8:00 am.

Step 1:

(You will need to create an account to see a list of all the workshops—unless you already have one, at that point, use your previously created one).

Step 2:

At the top of the page you will find a link to "**Find A Sign Up**"

On the right of that page under "**Search by the Sign Up Creator's Email**" enter:

(there will be a “captcha” code that you will need to enter)

Step 3:

You will be taken to a page with the list of all workshops. The workshops are listed alphabetically. You can change the view between "Icon View" and "List View" if you'd like.

Click on the title of the workshop for which you want to sign-up, which will take you to the sign up sheet (this will open a new tab in your browser.)

At the top of that page will be the workshop description and the dates that the workshop will be running.

Scroll down to the first available slot & click "Sign Up." You will then have to click "Submit & Sign Up" at the bottom of the page.

(Please note that the Student Grade Level is a required field.)

On the same page where you are entering the grade level, there is a toggle to display an alternate name for signing up. Please change this to the name of your student that will be attending this workshop.
