This workshop will be broken into stations for the first 30 minutes and the last 30 minutes will be open to one on one tutoring. The stations will focus on games/activities that cover Number Sense and Algebraic Skills. Students should bring the math materials that they are working on at home and be ready to ask for help.

Friday, 11:30-12:30 MATH LAB Workshop ---NEW DAY AND TIME

High School students

This workshop will spend first 15 minutes on study skills/review of math skills and the rest of the time will be open to one on one tutoring. Students will learn how to make different study aides to help them learn the math concepts. Students should bring the math materials that they are working on at home and be ready to ask for help.

We are also working on getting another tutor for the younger students (Grades 1-5) set up. We hope to have that in place shortly.
