

# Personalized Learning Public Charter School Students Outperform Their Peers

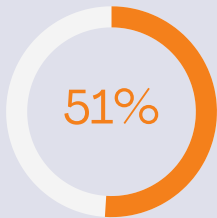


Students at Personalized Learning Public Charter schools in the APLUS+ network (representing approximately 30% (91 out of 310) of all non-classroom based public charter schools in California) showed significant learning growth during the pandemic as a result of adaptable and flexible learning delivered in multiple settings through a student-centric approach.

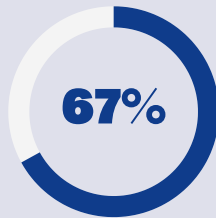
These students, especially socio-economic disadvantaged students, did not experience learning loss as many other public school students did during the pandemic. Instead, they made significant gains in proficiency. When comparing their iReady test results to statewide CAASPP data, these students outperform their peers at traditional public schools.

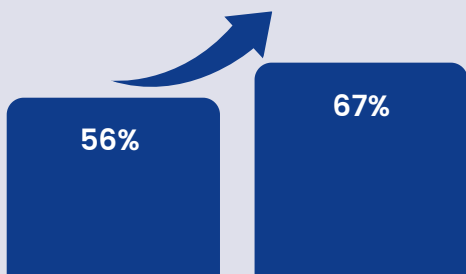

### Reading Proficiency

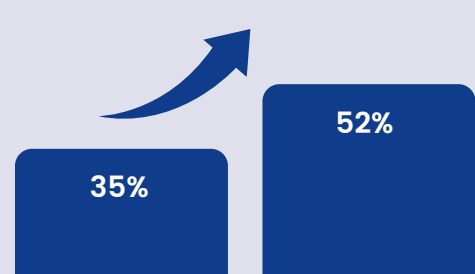

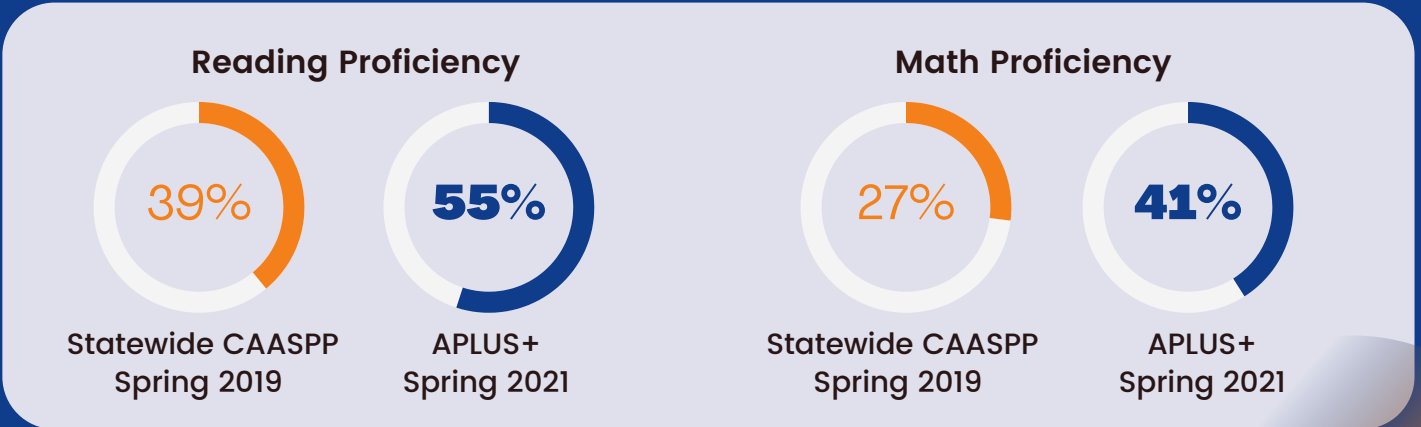

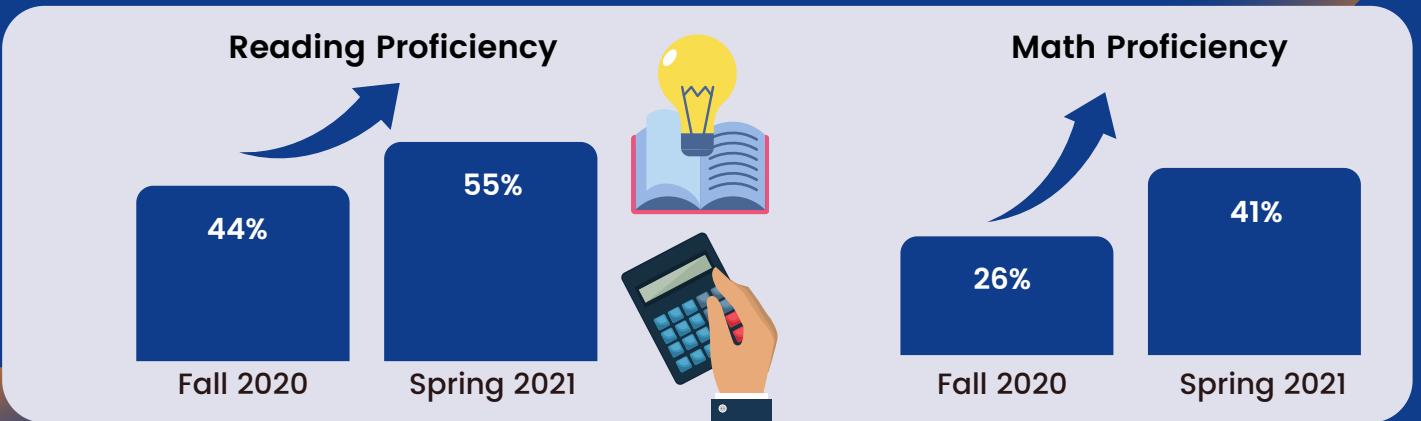

## Socio-economically disadvantaged students at APLUS+ schools made huge gains in math and reading proficiency during the pandemic



This data includes assessments of students in grades 3-8 & 11 at 26 Personalized Learning public charter schools throughout the state using iReady testing completed in Fall 2019, Spring 2020, Fall 2020, and Spring 2021.
